- The Illinois Secretary of State's office has announced that the deadline to renew driver's licenses, ID cards and license plate stickers has been extended to Nov. 1st. This new extension will also apply to those who have July, August and September expiration dates. These expired documents will remain valid until Nov. 1st.
- City Ordinance Update: All liquor licensees, liquor establishments, bars and restaurants within the City of Country Club Hills will cease operations and close for business by 12:00am/midnight Sunday through Friday and Saturday at 1:00am on Sunday.

Crime Prevention Tips

Gas Station Safety- Carjackers have identified gas stations as excellent locations to find victims. They simply wait for the moment when they can easily move into a vehicle and drive away. Many drivers leave their keys in the ignition and their cars unlocked when they get out to pump

gas. While the driver is out of the car, the carjacker can simply open the car door, get in the car and drive away. This is especially dangerous if your children and/or pets are in the vehicle.

Never leave your keys in the ignition. Take them out of the vehicle and lock your car while you are pumping gas. Also, do not leave valuables in plain sight.
