



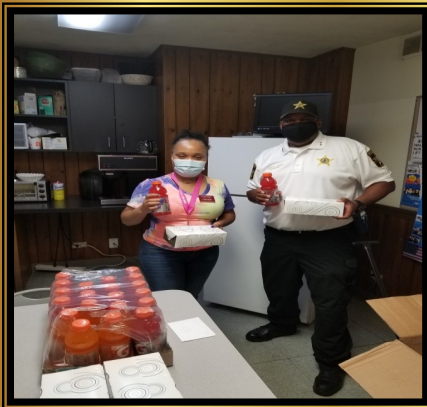
Chief's Corner
