Crime Prevention Tips

Preventing children involvement in crime...

To prevent your child from getting into trouble with the law, it's important to understand the reasons why most young people offend in the first place. There is generally no simple reason why. Certain circumstances can cause children to commit

crime include; problems at school, difficult family relationships, lack of boundaries and parental supervision, having friends who commit crime, drug and alcohol misuse, and mental health issues. Children are less likely to get into trouble if their parents have a good relationship with them and can talk openly with them, have sensible clear rules and stick to them as much as possible, and know where they are and what they are up to.
