Alderman Spivey shared there have been recent fires in his Ward and wanted to know when the \$500 assistance check would be available for the fire victims. There was a recent fire at 2275 Windsor and the occupant has left the property. Mayor shared the recent fire was due to 13 and 14 year old teenagers imitating a tick-tock video and it was due to negligence per CCH Fire findings and a check would not be issued. Alderman Spivey inquired as to why a check was issued for a resident who barbequed too close to the property and a check was issued to them. Alderwoman Evans questioned whether the check is issued to the tenant or the landlord. Alderman Spivey shared a check was cut to the landlord and the tenant for the barbeque incident. The landlord did not make the repairs and the tenant is currently looking for a place to live because the property is uninhabitable. Alderman Glispie asked if the tenant had insurance? Alderwoman Evans shared if the check is for displacement whether it is an accident or not the check should be issued to whoever is in need. Alderman Lockett shared the barbeque was an accident and tick-tock was a challenge. Alderwoman Evans shared the \$550 should be determined by CCHFire's determination of the occupants inability to reside. Alderman Spivey shared some residents have received \$1,000. Mayor Ford shared there was an occupant who received \$500 from the city and he write from his own personal account \$500 to assist them. Alderman Locktett shared he he assists residents it comes from his expense account. Alderman Spivey said he wants the occupant to receive the \$500 and Carl can call and locate the resident and give her the check.
