Recent Shootings in the Community

The CCHPD would like to advise residents that we have located and recovered the black Dodge Charger implicated in many shootings in the community. Three juvenile offenders were taken into custody and a weapon was seized. Our Investigations Division has filed charges and a court date is pending.

Nationwide, these shootings and carjacking incidents have involved juvenile gangs. The prevention efforts targeted at limiting youth involvement in gangs is integral to promoting optimal individual and community well-being. We must improve community supervision of our youth. The CCHPD, along

with surrounding jurisdictions are assessing the gang problem to develop better strategies for responding to gang activity.

Crime Prevention Tips

Dodge Charger/Challenger Security Upgrade - Dodge is now offering a second layer of security on its Challenger and Charger sedans to thwart theft and any attempts at taking these muscle cars out for joyrides. The system requires the driver to input a four-digit code into the infotainment

screen in order to get the car to go any faster than idle speed—or to use any more than 3 horsepower.

This is a free update available to any owner of a Charger or Challenger from 2015 or later model years. The update will be done at dealers, so any owners of these cars can contact theirs to schedule a time when the update can be done.
