Crime Prevention Tips

Flash Mob Retail Theft~ Your personal safety is your top priority. What to do if you find yourself in a flash mob style retail theft situation:

- Be aware of large groups gathering.
- Call 911 as soon as you can safely do so.

- DO NOT try to intervene or stop offenders.
- Don't be a victim but DO be a good witness.
- Obtain descriptions of those involved.
- Attempt to identify leaders of the group who might be giving orders or directing others on what to take or where to go.
- Obtain descriptions and/or license plate numbers of any associated vehicles.
- If appropriate, notify mall or store security.
