COVID-19 Scams

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General is alerting the public about fraud schemes related to COVID-19. Scammers are using telemarketing calls, text messages, social media platforms, and door-to-door visits to perpetrate COVID-19-related scams. Fraudsters are offering COVID-19 tests, HHS grants, and Medicare prescription cards in exchange for personal details, including Medicare information. However, these services are unapproved and illegitimate. The personal information collected can be used to fraudulently bill federal health care programs and commit medical identity theft.

- Do not give your personal or financial information to anyone claiming to offer HHS grants related to COVID-19.
- If you suspect COVID-19 health care fraud, report it immediately online or call 800-HHS-TIPS (800-447-8477).

15.6.07 Limitations of Off-Street Parking...

Added: H. Any recreational vehicle, including camping, trailer, motor home, mini motor home, travel trailer, truck camper or van camper, except that not more than one such vehicle registered to an owner of the residence may be parked on private property behind the front line of the residence thereon, on a hard surface.
