## Department News

### Naloxone Training

The CCHPD has partnered with the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH). The CCDPH has launched a comprehensive opioid-involved overdose prevention initiative to prevent opioid-involved overdose deaths. Through this partnership, CCHPD officers have received naloxone training and kits to use in the field if needed. Naloxone is a medication designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose. It can quickly restore normal respiration to a person whose breathing has slowed or stopped as a result of overdosing with heroin or prescription opioid pain medications.

## Crime Prevention & Safety Tips

Animal Services is an essential part of CCHPD's community-related services. These services include, but are not limited to, answering animal-related questions, picking up stray animals, assisting with vicious or diseased animals, lost and found pets, animal cruelty investigations, and enforcing local and state laws. CCHPD is passionate and committed to serving both the human and animal (domestic) residents of CCH. We ask that you do your part and ensure your pets are confined to their home and leashed or caged when out and about. In the unfortunate event your pet goes unaccounted for, immediately contact the CCHPD non-emergency line.

### Tips to Prevent Dognapping

- Supervise your dog outside
- Install surveillance cameras w/ motion sensors
- Keep your dog secured in a closed fenced area
- Use a Microchip and a GPS tracking collar
- Train your dog to not go up to strangers
- Be careful of social media posts about your pet
- Do not leave your dog outside for long periods of time
