5. COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS BY MAYOR FORD:

Mayor Ford asked Interim Fire Chief Hullinger to come before the City Council to share information on the collaborative diversity program between the Country Club Hills Fire Department and Prairie State College. Mayor Ford also shared in the southland there have been challenges in hiring minorities for the Fire Department. Mayor Ford shared that Prairie State College has established a program and Chief Hullinger will tell everyone what she is doing to bridge the gap in diversity with the Fire Department to acquire qualified minority participants. Chief Hullinger shared systemically nationwide and locally there is a shortage of qualified firefighters, paramedics and EMT's. There is a problem with recruitment and retention also focusing on minorities. It is the goal of the Country Club Hills Fire Department to recruit, and train interested minority candidates who are interested minority candidates in Country Club Hills and underserved and at risk communities in the southland and to Chicago. Country Club Hills has partnered with Prairie State College to help support a statewide grant called the Workforce Equity Initiative (WEI) Program. The program focuses on expanding opportunities for minorities. Through the WEI program the books and the tuition, books and lab fees are all paid for through Prairie State College. Prairie State College is continuously working to secure grant money to grow this program. There is a recruitment camp that will be coning in June for High school seniors or above at an employable age. At the camp candidates will be placed in gear, they will be exposed to the city's burn tower facility and a they will be exposed to EMS because requirements are for Firefighter/EMT or Firefighter/Paramedic. Prairie State has secured great funding for this program as they continue to secure additional funding to again grow this wonderful program. Chief Hullinger then shared an impactful letter from a recent participant/graduate. She shared she was hopeful this letter would reflect the success and warrants the continuation and support of this program. The letter began with thanks and appreciation to Chief Hullinger for the opportunity to be a candidate and participate with this program to benefit the Country Club Hills Fire Department as a student with Prairie State College. The letter shared the program was challenging yet rewarding and shared a clear behind the scenes view of actual professionals. The letter went on to say the personal stories, sharing of extensive knowledge and mentorship from the firefighters gave them a view to appreciate the brotherhood and its' bond. The letter continued to share the door reaching, the ladder utilization, pulling hoses, treating

victims and extinguishing fires were valuable lessons that will be carried on forever. The graduate again shared their appreciation from the Country Club Hills Fire Department. Lastly, the letter shared thank you is insufficient to express their gratitude as other departments turn the individual down and Country Club Hills took a chance, welcomed and allowed the graduate in. The graduate will continue their hard work and diligence to make Chief Hullinger and the department proud of their decision. The graduate also shared these experiences are lifelong and greatly appreciates this program. Alderman Lockett asked if there was an age limit. Chief Hullinger shared they will take high school seniors but it can be challenging due to the night time class hours and weekend requirements. Chief shared the maximum age would be 35 because you can't of department testing. Alderman Spivey asked to reiterate high school senior to age 35 and Chief confirmed. Chief Hullinger also shared she would like to include giving those under the age of high school seniors exposure to the profession. Mayor Ford shared this individual lives in the city of Country Club Hills and Chief Hullinger confirmed yes and graduated with high honors. Alderman Spivey shared maybe one day we can have him come before the city council. Chief Hullinger then shared information on a program that whereas the individual will go to the fire academy, graduate then go to EMT or go to EMT, graduate and go to the fire academy which will make students employable to departments in two semesters. Alderman Lockett inquired about the fire explorer cadet program. Chief shared it was a boy scout program that was challenging due to staffing problems and she may revisit it in the future.
