## Crime Prevention & Safety Tips

**Back-to-School** days bring congestion and an increase in potential hazards.

### Here Are Some Back-To-School Safe Driving Tips:

- Slow down and drive extra cautiously in the School Zone Area.
- Don't load or unload children across the street from the school.
- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.
- Stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- Be prepared for kids walking to appear in unexpected places, like from between parked cars
- Be prepared for kids on bikes to turn in front of you without looking or signaling.
- If you need to use your phone, be sure you're pulled over safely.
- Watch for kids walking while looking at their phones.
- Don't ever block a crosswalk or sidewalk.
- If possible, carpool to reduce the number of cars at school.
