Greetings,

Last year, the City Ordinance pertaining to 3am-6am parking was amended to read that any property owner may park his or her vehicle in front of that owner's house for three (3) days in any thirty (30) day period.

Please be advised that starting December 15th, the current online parking permission form on the City website will only allow for a vehicle to be entered into the system three times in a thirty day period. Once the three day allotment has been exhausted that vehicle may not be parked on the roadway from 3am-6am for the remainder of that thirty day period. Please keep this in mind to avoid citations being issued for vehicles found to be in violation.

Kia Hyundai TikTok Challenge Update

Hyundai has released a glass break sensor security kit that targets the method of entry used by thieves to break into these vehicles. These kits are available for purchase and installation at Hyundai dealerships and Compustar authorized installers. The MSRP for the kit is \$170, not including labor/installation. At this time, the cost of an aftermarket immobilizer falls on the vehicle owner. Hyundai is also developing a software update to further secure these targeted vehicles.

Kia offers a paid Stolen Vehicle Recovery service to assist in the recovery of stolen

vehicles and asks owners to call the Consumer Assistance Center at 800-333-4542 if they have questions. CCHPD is currently working to obtain more "The Club" devices from Kia and Hyundai.

Crime Prevention & Safety Tips

Safely Buying and Using Holiday Gift Cards

- Gift cards are for GIFTS, decline ANY unsolicited demands for payment by gift card online or via phone. Gift cards are only an acceptable form of payment with their affiliated brand.
- Check physical gift cards for package tampering before you buy them. If the scratch-off material covering the card's PIN number is uncovered, pick another card.
- Buy gift cards directly from retailers, trusted sources and known brands; especially when you buy online.
- Avoid buying from online auction sites because the cards may be fake or stolen.
- Store your gift cards securely. Keep physical cards in a wallet, purse, or other secure place. Also, leave the PIN covered scratch-off material in place until the PIN is required.
- Never share a gift card account or PIN number with people you don't know.
- Send physical gift cards via trackable shipping methods and e-gifts via a secure email/mobile apps.
